1. Cueva del Tesoro, Rincón de la Victoria

In the province of Málaga there are numerous caves with a high natural value, where caving can be practiced, as the Cueva del Tesoro, in Rincón de la Victoria, one of the three marine origin caves that can be visited in the world. Its name comes from a folk tradition legend, which claims that the cave hosts a hidden treasure from the Arabic period. This aura of mystery has increased its attractive, and nowadays it is one of the most visited places in the Costa del Sol.



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2. Cueva del Gato, Benaoján

The Cueva del Gato is located next to the municipality of Benaoján, a few kilometres away from Ronda. It is formed by the cavern and the cavity which carry out the waters from the Guadares or Gaduares river. With its more than ten kilometres and its ten different walks, this is one of the most complex speleological systems of Andalusia. If the inner is fantastic, the surroundings are not less: a crystalline lake lies outside.

3. Cueva Excéntrica and Cueva Fuensanta, Igualeja

In the Valle del Genal are located the Cueva Excéntrica and the Cueva de la Fuensanta, two natural amazingly beautiful monuments. Situated in Igualeja, these caves are surrounded by one of the most impressive places of our geography: the Parque Natural de la Sierra de las Nieves and they are perfect to first step into the underworld.
